Combating the uncertainties of a weakened US economy, we served 101,468 meals in 2015, including 64,544 snacks that were prepared for the Educational Resources for Children (ERfC), an after school program. We gave out 38,094 equivalent meals for emergency home consumption. These numbers do not include items such as bread, pastries, drinks, fresh vegetables and fruits that our guests can take home with them. The news media reports that the economy is improving steadily, and employment reached new levels exceeding that of last

year. At Enfield's Loaves and Fishes, we have recorded a substantial 36 % increase in meals served last year to those in need.

Our mission to "ease the hunger of the homeless, unemployed, the underemployed and working poor in the area" is a credit to the support of Enfield and surrounding communities. Wonderful, dedicated Volunteers offer to serve the hungry / needy, even on weekends and Holidays. Many have children at home, or elderly family members whom they care for, and still find time to share their love and compassion with our Guests. Volunteers become thrilled when they witness the difference they can make in someone's life, and soon become regulars at Loaves and Fishes. We have even had Volunteers walk to the Soup Kitchen in near blizzard conditions, even when parking bans were in effect – just to help serve a hot meal to a hungry soul. This is a precious gift that rests in the heart, and is impossible to place a value upon it. Hot, nutritious meals served each day have made the Soup Kitchen a haven for those with so little. It is a blessing and comforting just to feel warm, safe, and loved in today's environment.

We are grateful that many private individuals, businesses, schools, churches, and civic organizations have collaborated throughout the year to improve Enfield Loaves and Fishes Soup Kitchen. A special Thank You goes out to every Volunteer working behind the scenes, the ones you rarely see – those who gather in the food and stock the shelves, wash fruit and vegetables, prepare and cook the food, carve the meat, decorate the dining room, wash and dry dishes, clean tables and floors, etc. These tasks, although not as attractive as serving the meal, are certainly essential to the operation. Maintaining the property, appreciating our blessings, finding good old fashioned values in all people, and instilling neighborly relations are key in continuing this service to ever increasing numbers of needy people.

This report is only a glimpse of who we are and what we do. The Annual Report provides insight into how effective Loaves and Fishes is by feeding the hungry / needy among us, and serving the community. It is also a plea and gentle reminder of how your donations can help to ensure the ongoing survival of the Soup Kitchen.

Perhaps that is was my way of making up for all the sadness in my own life. I try to help people that I meet see the more beautiful side to life and recently gave a homeless woman some money to help her.

I first came to the Soup Kitchen on a Saturday, only to find that lunch was over. Before that, I was living on MREs, and weighed 128 pounds. I am so thankful that Murray answered the door. I was truly starving! My expression changed from sadness to joy when Murray offered me his two sandwiches and a soda or milk. You saved my life that day!

I haven't given up hope. I'm 53 now, and have been coming to the SK about a year. I have insurance and a cell phone, and I sleep in my truck when it's cold. I clean up at the gym every day, and have a sandwich or banana from the Soup Kitchen. Each day I am blessed to have meats, starches, fruits, vegetables, milk, and now weigh about 150 pounds. I thank God for You and Priscilla. You both are a God Send."

We have gone from serving **15,625** meals in **1992** to **101,468** meals in **2015**, while **64,544** snacks were prepared for children in Educational Resources for Children (ERfC). Of the thousands of meals served, more than **40%** went to children both in the soup kitchen and ERfC after school programs. Food for **38,094** meals was provided for home consumption in emergency situations, especially during the winter.

We are staffed almost exclusively by volunteers from the community and operate under the guidance of a Director and a volunteer Board of Directors. For information, contact Priscilla at pbelf@aol.com.
