Message from the Director of Finance, Francie Berger

I am the newest member of the Loaves and Fishes team. I took on the newly created role of Director of Finance and Administration in December. While I am handling all responsibilities related to the financial side of the organization, I am currently focused on our move from 28 Prospect Street to 23 North Main Street, the former site of Silvia's International Restaurant.

It is an exciting and humbling time to be here. The COVID-19 pandemic has more than doubled the number of those in need of a hot meal and a caring hand in our community. Our Board of Directors anticipated this and was proactive in finding the perfect new space in which to better serve our guests.

Extensive renovations were needed to bring the building up to code. We have put on a new roof, updated electrical and HVAC systems, installed a new combination boiler/water heater, replaced damaged ceiling tiles, and put in fire protection and security systems. We are working with Eversource on a cost-saving program to install energy efficient lighting throughout the building. We will also be reopening the walk-up/ drive-through window, which dates from the time the building was a bank. This will be a tremendous aid in serving our guests until we can

safely invite them back inside.

We have saved money wherever possible, but the costs have added up. Through your generosity we have been able to handle many of the expenses, but we are still need your financial support. Due to the building's layout, 90% of our food storage will be in the basement. Currently the only access to this space is via a steep, narrow staircase. We are in desperate need of a Vertical Platform Lift. Not quite an elevator, but more than just a dumbwaiter, this lift would allow for a person and a food cart to travel between the basement and the kitchen upstairs. This is not just a convenience; it is a necessary safety measure.

To help raise the money for this lift and our other outstanding renovation bills, we have started a Go Fund Me campaign that can be found at https://charity. gofundme.com/o/en/campaign/enfield-loaves-and-fishes-help-us-feed-our-neighbors. To Priscilla, Mike, and the whole team at Enfield Loaves and Fishes, you are a blessing!!!. What they do and the resources they have saved our lives. We have never been homeless, let alone ever had to sleep in a car. We lost all hope, cold, hungry, alone, scared, depressed, confused and helpless. We tried to get help for our situation from other agencies with little being offered. I was told to contact Priscilla, so with nothing left to lose, I went to the Soup Kitchen, in tears, and found Priscilla who gave me a warm anxiety blanket and food, for which I was extremely grateful. A few nights later, I was having car issues to get to the Soup Kitchen. I was desperate when I finally arrived, Priscilla took me in, let me sit down, get warm, and eat a good meal. She then got a hold of several people who managed to get me into Cornerstone in Vernon. Since I'm a survivor of domestic violence with PTSD and a cancer patient I was then able to be moved to a hotel through a grant for the homeless. Through all of what has happened to me, Priscilla never gave up on me, and has restored my faith in humanity. I know I'm not the only one who she has helped and I know I won't

We have gone from serving **15,625** meals in **1992** to **177,245** meals in **2020**, which includes snacks for children in Educational Resources for Children (ERfC) programs. Food for **83,854** meals was provided for home consumption.

We are staffed almost exclusively by volunteers from the community and operate under the guidance of a Director and a volunteer Board of Directors.


